

SAFETY RULES APPLIES FOR BOTH PRACTICAL DEFENSE AND ALL COMPETITIVE SHOOTINGS

Event Rules



- All participants will run the course at their own risk.
- All firearms will be unloaded, actions open bores flagged on the table / rack provided.
- No unnecessary handling of firearms until it is the participants turn to shoot.
- No magazine will be loaded into the pistol and the hammer will be down.
- Any caliber handgun permitted (we do not use major / minor scoring).
- All shooters must have eye and ear protection and a true holster, no belt clips. Holders additional magazines / speed loaders are permitted but not required.
- Round Count: Bring at least 50 rounds for handguns and enough magazines for 18-30 rounds per stage. Rifle: 60 rounds. Shotgun: 10 Slug 25 shot shell. Others as listed.
- Beginner friendly 3 magazines for semi autos or 2 speed loaders for revolvers are recommended, but not required.
- Participants must engage safeties and remove fingers from within the trigger guard while moving between stations and while the gun is being holstered and unholstered.
- No class III weapons, sawed off shotguns, alcohol or other illegal or dangerous activities will be permitted while on club grounds.
- Any participant not adhering to the safety rules outlined in the shooters meeting will be asked to leave the event without refund. This is a no tolerance policy and enforced for the safety of all.
- All Matches – Ammunition is subject to approval by an RSO or Club Executive. During Steel Matches, no steel cased, steel core, AP, incendiary rounds, +P, +P+ are permitted.

All Events are an informal match style using IDPA silhouette targets. Shooters' meeting will cover safety and course scenarios before each match. Beginners are welcome, we will assist new shooters.



Another safety reminder:

- **Always** keep your gun pointed in a safe direction.
- **Always** keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- **Always** keep the firearm unloaded until ready to use.
- Know your target and what is beyond.
- Know how to use the gun safely.
- Be sure the gun is safe to operate.
- Use only the correct ammunition for your gun.
- Wear eye & ear protection as appropriate.
- Never use alcohol or drugs (including prescription or over the counter) while handling a firearm.
- Store guns in a safe place so they are not accessed by unauthorized persons.
- Regularly maintain and clean your gun so it operates properly.
- Be aware if additional precautions are required for your firearm.
